#### WHAT TO DO IF YOUR FRIEND OR FAMILY MEMBER IS DETAINED

#### 1. Contact Immigration to locate your friend or family member.

- You will need: (a) person's full name (including any aliases);
  - (b) date of birth;
  - (c) Alien Registration Number ("A #"). If you do not know this number, ask the officer for it when you call.
- You can call Immigration at:

- o You can also ask for the name of the deportation officer assigned to the case
- o If the officer will not release the information, explain who you are (such as a translator for the family), politely ask for a reason for the refusal, and ask to speak with a supervisory deportation officer.
- You can also call local Immigration facilities and say, "I need to locate someone in immigration custody." Appendix C contains the contact information for immigration facilities in or near Massachusetts.

#### 2. Contact a lawyer or community organization for assistance.

- Appendix A contains a list of legal aid organizations in New England.
- Appendix B contains a list of non-legal organizations in Massachusetts.
- Have as much information about the detained person and his or her immigration history when calling.

# 3. Contact the deportation officer and the detention center about health or family issues, such as:

- A detainee's health or medication
- A detainee's children, especially if the detainee is the sole caretaker of a child in the United States

#### 4. Allow a detainee to call you

• Call Correctional Billing Services at 1-800-844-6591. Follow prompts to prepay for calls to a <u>land line telephone</u> (not a cell phone).

#### 5. Find out from a detained person:

- charges and date on the Notice to Appear given to him or her by Immigration
- date of entry into the U.S., any prior deportation orders, any prior criminal arrests, family members with legal status
- any special needs in detention for medication, diet, religion, etc.

• whether he or she has designated anyone to care for his or her children or make decisions about personal property. If not, ask the detainee for the name, address, and date of birth for people who could do that.

#### 6. Contact the consulate for the detainee's country of origin:

- It is helpful to inform the consulate about a detainee's case in case she needs to advocate for the detainee
- If necessary, a consulate can provide travel documents to a detainee

#### 7. Find out the Immigration Court date of a detainee

- Call 1-800-898-7180 (Spanish or English). Follow the prompts. You will need the detainee's A# for this automated system to work.
- If the A# is not recognized in the system, call the next day. It may take a few days for a person's A# to be entered in the system.
- You can also call this number to find out the judge if the person already had an immigration hearing.
- If a person was ordered deported, he will not receive a new date to appear before an immigration judge.

#### 8. Visit a detained person if you have legal immigration status

- Call the jail for visiting hours. Be prepared to give your full name, date of birth, and social security number for security clearance.
- Undocumented individuals should not visit a detention center or jail

#### 9. Help a detainee prepare for bond

- Many detainees can ask the immigration judge for bond at their first or second hearing.
- Not all detainees can get a bond to get out of detention. For example, someone already ordered deported cannot get a bond. Some criminal convictions also prevent a person from getting bond. Consult with a lawyer.
- Give the detainee letters from family members with legal status or other persons with legal status in the community willing to help or provide financial assistance if the detainee is released. The letters should be translated into English and include:
  - o Full name, date of birth, and legal status (with proof of status, like a copy of a green card) of the person writing the letter
  - o Explanation of how the writer knows the detainee
  - o Information about the detainee's activities in the community, character, and other examples of why the detainee would not be a danger to the community and would return to court for his or her next hearing
- It is helpful if the people writing letters can come to the detainee's court hearing
